## Welcome to GWRRA Rider Education

*Until Chapter G gets a Chapter Rider Educator, my friend and Former Region F Educator and now Chapter CO-Q Educator, Howie Peterson, has graciously allowed me to publish his monthly articles in the Chapter NH-G Newsletter. Editor*

### “PRICE TAG”

I just finished reading my latest edition of Motorcycle Consumer News, and once again became somewhat agitated over the number of motorcycle fatalities that keep occurring. It was very interesting to note that while the article listed fatalities involving alcohol or drug consumption being part and parcel of the situation, nothing was mentioned about rider education. I find this lack in the study somewhat confusing as given the preponderance of various types of motorcycles involved; surely the study could have addressed rider education in some fashion.



Fatal Accident Reporting System operated by the Federal Highway Traffic Safety Administration. Another way of looking at the figures gives BMW a factor of deaths per 1000 units of 0.24. Harley-Davidson has factor of 0.55, and All Others a factor of 0.46. Again, these are pertinent to the discussion as we go along. In 2012, motorcyclist fatalities rose to 4743, with the percentages of factors remaining approximately the same.

There is an old Merle Haggard song that in part seems to run through my mind while reading the article which goes like this: “We keep drinking, and we keep smoking, having fun and never thinking; laughing at the **price tag** that we pay. We keep roaring down the fast lane, like two young men feeling no pain; and the reason for quitting getting bigger each day.” That sums up the whole article for the most part, given the figures and pie charts listed.

I realize I often quote Samuel Clemens regarding statistics, but a few need to be listed to get us through the article. 2005-2010 Motorcyclist Fatalities looked like this: BMW- 17 (there is a reason for doing this in the article), Harley-Davidson- 692, All Others-1330 for a total 2039. This information comes from FARS, the

Now we get closer into the causation of the fatalities; rider

deaths without helmets -38 percent; crashes involving measurable alcohol-40 percent. Blood alcohol by motorcycle type; Harley-Davidson 47.2 percent; All Others-35.5 percent. Before the reader draws the conclusion that I am picking on Harley-Davidson for some unknown reason, that is far from the facts. The reason these figures jump out at me is explained as we now go further into the article.

Motorcycle injuries and deaths causation factor is predicated on several more factors, no matter what type of motorcycle is being operated. First and foremost, attitude; which type of motorcycle(s) and therefore riders display most often unsafe attitudes towards safe riding, and even more importantly, motorcycle training? Which motorcycle operators by motorcycle

type(s) display the attitude of safety gear while riding? And which motorcyclists by motorcycle type(s) are prevalent to ride under the influence of alcohol? I will let you draw those conclusions for yourself. These factors are predominantly an American issue given the attitude of “it’s my right” syndrome. Again, the reader can look at the figures and figure this one out.

A look at other Countries applies herein, and I will name only two, Japan and England although many other countries would factor into the equation also. In these two Countries, it takes five (5) years to get a fully certified motorcycle operator’s license. There are several steps involved along the way limiting motorcycle engine size, and motorcycle training, which is mandatory. The end result is graded by actual motorcycle officers along with written examinations. Display of the wrong attitude, inattention to riding gear, among other items results in licensing “washout”. Riding DUI with an endorsement of any type results in losing the motorcycle operator’s license.

And I ask myself, why not us? The fatality rates for these other Countries is nil compared to those here in America, and that should tell us something about our system of training, etc. And this does not even count their relicensing programs! Rider education plays the largest part in reducing motorcycle crashes (note I am not using accident) in all aspects. Along with skill levels, most programs address riding gear, alcohol and drugs, attitude, and more. Does this mean the motorcycle operator will become the type of rider we wish all riders would be? Of course not; however, it is a start.

Back to those other Countries for just a bit. I can identify a motorcyclist just about as far as I can see him/her as to whether they are out of Country, or not! Notice the gear, notice the riding techniques, and notice the attitudes, and it is no wonder these folks can “ride” and do it most likely safer than we Americans! Serious training can do that for a person.

Now the punch line, if there should be one; why did I list motorcycle types in the statistics? Who has the fewest

accidents and fatalities? BMW riders! Check these guys and gals out some time, and you will notice they fit all the positive factors of this article, or at least what the article is driving towards, pun intended. Now back to the Merle Haggard song; there is a **price tag** that is driven by us the motorcyclist. We can pay that price up front with all the correct or right aspects, or we can pay it later from all the wrong reasons. Unfortunately, the **price tag** in motorcycle crashes is paid down the line in all aspects as well. You can think about that one for a minute or two, and you will most probably come up with my meaning. I want to quote the bottom line that few consider regarding motorcycle crashes, injuries, and fatalities as follows.

**“However, the statistics revealed here clearly show that certain aspects of motorcycling, such as impaired riding (and I insert lack of rider education and training) dominate the sports fatality rates, and we must do a better job. For the good of our sport, the motorcycle community must be the source of any ”improvements.” And if our grades don’t improve, we can expect “tutoring” from the insurance industry, the courts, and the government.”** Folks, there is legislation in various states and in Washington D.C. pertaining to just these issues!

We as motorcyclists must become the shining beacon of reason within our motorcycling community in everything we do motorcycle wise; our behaviors, riding gear, attitudes, and more. Our goal should, and must be to improve the “grades” that indicates while there is risk involved, we as responsible “bikers” are doing our part to reduce crashes, injuries, and fatalities. **AND ABOVE ALL, RIDE WITH PRIDE AND CONFIDENCE!**

## Good News/Bad News

From the March 21 issue of *The Week* magazine comes this bit of good news/bad news:

Apple's mobile operating system wants to merge with your car.... The iPhone and iPad maker last week unveiled Apple CarPlay, which lets you "bring your own phone into your car's dashboard for mapping, messaging, voice controls, and more."

Volvo, Hyundai, Honda, Jaguar, Ferrari, and Mercedes-Benz have already agreed to integrate CarPlay into their upcoming models, while partnerships with BMW, Subaru, Toyota and Ford are in the works. Apple's offering is part of "a growing trend toward using your own device in your in-

car dash." CarPlay outdoes the competition, including GM's Mylink, which works with both iOS

and Android phones, according to Damon Lavrinc in *Wired.com*.

Not everyone is onboard, though, says James O'Toole in *CNN.com*. Some safety experts worry that CarPlay will simply introduce a new set of distractions for drivers who are multitasking. "We're very, very concerned about it," says David Teater, senior director at the nonprofit National Safety Council. "The auto industry and the consumer electronics industry are really in an arms race to see how we can enable drivers to do stuff other than driving."

For their part, the tech companies—including Google, which said in January that it would partner with Audi, GM, Honda, and Hyundai to integrate its Android operating system into cars starting this year—claim their software will make driving safer "by allowing drivers to keep their eyes on the road."

That may be true, but studies have shown that "talking in hands-free mode while driving is just as unsafe as driving

while holding a phone." Even motorists who keep their eyes focused on the traffic around them may find their "minds focused elsewhere."

As this writer culled from a previous article (*The Week*, November 8, 2013), inasmuch as we use the "everything boxes" in our pockets for so many different tasks, we develop a vast range of triggers and cues associated with pulling them out and looking at them. In essence, the smart phones themselves train us to respond to their insistent prompts—sometimes even at unconscious levels. Sometimes we respond out of curiosity, sometimes out of loneliness, sometimes just to scratch the itch the smartphone has planted in our brains. That's right—your smartphone has trained you to respond to its beeps just as surely as Pavlov's experiment trained dogs to salivate at the ringing of a bell!

What can we motorcyclists do to protect ourselves? First, we must assume that motorists around us will be increasingly paying less attention to our presence, and so we must be much more cautious. Second, we must all assume an unofficial responsibility to spread the gospel of motorist awareness—reminding the public (all our friends and acquaintances) to actively look for motorcyclists—live people—out there whenever they get behind a wheel.
