"WHERE FROM HERE?"

2016, another year lies ahead of us full of promise, and hopefully great adventures involving lots of riding, fine food, great scenery, warm days, and smooth pavement. This past year I have covered many facets of rider safety information, hints, and tidbits that have hopefully provided reasoned input to enhance our riding skills, and general information to keep our rides enjoyable and safe. At times, it seems as if I am going over information that we have already heard as in the proverbial "if I have told you once, I have told you a hundred times"! Up to a point, repetition is valuable as a method to reinforce learning process(s). After that, repetition may well become "done that, heard that" in nature.

As I have stated before, even if we have heard some training before, the old adage of "don't use, lose it" still applies. Knowledge, like skills has a habit of disappearing into the background, filed away in some file within our mental computer under a heading we don't remember. And as we age, for many of us, that is just the natural process of things. At one time I was a whiz at math, and now for the life of me I cannot even remember simple theorems from high school! Not that I really need these any more, however, at times it is the critical knowledge along with skills that remains hid away just when we need it the most. Thus it is back to repetition, however, I will still attempt to come up with topics that provide food for thought, and bring along the needed training for upgrading skills, and levels of rider education.

You the member have some homework for the coming year, namely if you read an article on motorcycle riding, or any other subject that you feel may be a good topic for a newsletter, or presentation at our meetings, pass it along to me. When it comes to borrowing others information, I don't even blush with shame! Heck, as long as the proper folks get the credit where legal or otherwise, all information sharing is good.

Therefore, as the title says, where to from here for 2016? In looking at the database, we will need to schedule some seminars and classes for the coming year. Several members need new or updating on Co-Rider; MFA will again be offered; riding courses at the district convention in August for those needing those; Parking Lot Practice for both forms of motorcycles this spring; another Road Captains Course; Tour Riding for the membership to compliment the Road Captains Course, which will get the "have too's" out of the way. I plan on having a trailering course this spring as well, which we can use both for enjoyment along with training. There are some other items we may use at our chapter gatherings as well that play into rider education and can be done in a brief time period. One thought for 2016 involves using each ride as a training run implementing those skills we have been taught, seen in videos, or even read about in magazines. I realize this may a little tough on those long straight runs down the super slab, yet focusing on speed, lane position, and traffic can assist there as well. Remember the "what if" exercise? Another great exercise while riding. Between now and spring, don't let PMS (parked motorcycle syndrome) get you down.

"January, January"




No, the title of this article is not a typographical error. I didn't stutter. But I did repeat myself for a reason, which I'll get to in a following paragraph.

As I'm writing this for the January issue of our Chapter's newsletter, I couldn't help thinking about the first month, and what it's named for, and how it relates to Motorist Awareness.

January is the first month of the year in the Julian and Gregorian calendars and one of seven months with the length of 31 days. The first day of the month, known as New Year's Day, looks both forward to new events and challenges and backward to consider how we all did in the previous 12 months. Indeed, it's altogether appropriate to consider January as a month to "look twice."

In ancient Roman religion and myth, Janus is the god of beginnings and transitions, and thereby of gates, doors, doorways, passages and endings. He is usually depicted as having two faces, since he looks to the future and to the past. (See the image of the two faces of Janus accompanying this article.) Although some folks think the month of January was named for Juno, another Roman god, I favor the opinion that naming it after Janus makes better sense.

The god Janus was also said to preside over the beginning and ending of conflict, and hence war and peace. The doors of his temple were open in time of war, and closed to mark the peace. As a god of transitions, he had functions pertaining to birth and to



journeys and exchange, and he was concerned with travelling, trading and shipping.

So what does any of this palaver have to do with Motorist Awareness? It's really a good reminder that (especially during January when dirty, icy smears coat almost every vehicle's side windows and rearview mirrors) motorists should consider the example of Janus and look twice to save a life. At an intersection, look left, then right, then left and right again. Think of the article title—"January, January"—as you do so. It will be a little reminder of how to be sure there's not trouble/conflict/war coming quickly toward you when you least expect it.

Well-trained motorists realize that looking twice is a wise practice. And practice it you should! Sometimes,

the most unexpected things can appear suddenly outside your vehicle even in January. Deer, elk, dogs, sheep, moose, snowmobiles, motorcycles, sidewise skidding garbage trucks—they all can come careening toward you when you least expect it.



So, this month, take a tip from your buddy Janus. Do twice as much looking for trouble and your year ahead will be more peaceful, more healthy, and more fun. Think "January, January."
